WELCOME TO OUR MONTHLY ROUND-UP JULY EDITION

Throughout July, we leveraged the success of Eid to extend crucial support worldwide. In Bangladesh, our focus was providing food to street children, raising awareness about child rights, education, and equipping older children with vocational training, including sewing machines. Across Gaza, we swiftly responded to the emergency at the Jenin Refugee Camp by delivering emergency kits and supplying sterilised medical gloves to hospitals across the region.

Our work in Pakistan encompassed the initiation of new housing for those affected by the 2022 floods, alongside the establishment of water filtration plants to ensure consistent access to safe water. Phase 2 of our housing project was successfully completed, complemented by the distribution of essential food parcels in Punjab.

In Somalia, we embarked on a cataract project, delivering crucial surgeries and training to combat avoidable blindness. Meanwhile, our commitment to supporting displaced individuals in Northwest Syria persisted, with comprehensive medical care, vaccinations, psychological assistance, and essential services provided by Al Imaan Hospital, Masshad Ruhin, and Mariam Primary Health Care Centres.

July marked the launch of our Back to School drive across five nations: Pakistan, Palestine, Somalia, Syria, and Yemen. This initiative aims to deliver vital back-to-school kits, and in a significant achievement, Yemen celebrated the inauguration of a new school in Alkarshib district, Almahoot governorate. As this campaign progresses, our unwavering dedication to children's education promises a brighter future.

Furthermore, a new chapter unfolded as we established an office in Senegal, reaffirming our commitment to extending aid to all corners of the globe.

HEALTH

In partnership with Americares, Human Appeal proudly unveils a cutting-edge healthcare hub in Al Zohoor. This centre houses dedicated inpatient, women and children's clinics, a fully-equipped laboratory, a pharmacy, dental services, and a vital psychosocial support clinic. All services are offered with compassion and at no cost, ensuring accessible healthcare for all.

In the face of neighbouring hospital closures, resulting in a significant surge in patient numbers, Mariam Primary Health Care Centre remains committed to providing vital and no-cost medical services to the most vulnerable individuals across North West Syria.

HEALTH

In the wake of multiple hospital closures nearby, Al Imaan Hospital has witnessed a surge in patients. Prioritising maternal and paediatric care, the hospital stands resolute. It further extends its support through a free pharmacy, catering to the healthcare needs of displaced Syrians grappling with restricted medical accessibility.

LIVELIHOODS

Following the successful paving of the roads and installation of street lights, Human Appeal has initiated a new safety phase at Al Zohoor Town. We've started to construct **25 fire safety rooms**, each equipped with fire extinguishers to mitigate the risk of fire hazards in the future.



HEALTH

In remote camps with limited healthcare access, Human Appeal is continuing to provide vaccinations, helping to reduce the spread of preventable diseases, which would have a huge effect on young children.



Human Appeal Somalia partners with the Somali Federal Ministry of Health, driving a 6-day training initiative for **60 frontline healthcare heroes**. Equipped with vital knowledge, they'll combat avoidable blindness, making a lasting impact in diverse regions and communities across the country.

In partnership with the Federal Ministry of Health, Human Appeal Somalia is actively implementing an ongoing Cataract Surgery initiative. Our aim is to offer free cataract removal surgeries to around **1,000 patients**. Currently, **88 individuals** have successfully undergone the surgery to restore their vision.

FOOD SECURITY



In collaboration with Green Lane Mosque (GLM) Human Appeal distributed **100 food packs** in Samudari, Faisalabad, in Punjab. Targeting families caring for orphans, headed by widows or with little to no income each food pack contained a nourishing mix: **20kg wheat flour**, **6 litres of cooking oil**, **4kg of rice**, **3kg of sugar**, and pulses.

SHELTER



Human Appeal has broken ground on a project to build **100 two-bedroom homes** in Dadu in the Sindh Province. Each home will be built 5 feet above ground-level, with bricks and steel girders. These homes are designed to enhance flood resilience and offer lasting shelter.

WASH

(WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE)




Human Appeal Pakistan has begun a project to install **10 water filtration plants** in the districts of Dadu and Qambar Shadakhot, providing them with safe and filtered water for years to come. Each plant will provide clean water to over **3,000 people** each day.

SHELTER



In the village of Ghulam Hussain Chandio, we have successfully built **28 homes** for families that lost their homes in last year's floods as part of Phase 1 of our housing project. These resilient homes are built six-feet above ground level, and are a testament to our commitment to safeguarding against future flooding. Our aim is to complete **250 homes** in the near future with your help.

PALESTINE

EMERGENCY RESPONSE



Human Appeal distributed **433 emergency response kits**, following the assault on Jenin Refugee Camp in the West Bank in early July. Each parcel contained essential items to meet the immediate needs, including canned foods, diapers, powdered milk and personal hygiene items.

HEALTH



We delivered essential medical supplies to the Ministry of Health in Gaza, delivering sterilised gloves for surgery to **11 different hospitals** across the Gaza Strip.

YEMEN



Al Samad School is now ready to welcome students, providing a secure and safe environment for learning.

EDUCATION



Al-Samad School in Yemen has been successfully built, and will soon be able to receive students.

BANGLADESH



FOOD SECURITY



We provided nutritious meals to **95 street children** every day across **three locations** in Bangladesh, providing a total of **2,945 meals** in July alone, and **24,840 meals** overall.

LIVELIHOODS



Eight graduates of our seamstress training course received sewing machines, **four boys** received training in motorcycle servicing, and **eight girls** received tailoring and beautician training.

EDUCATION



Currently, **34 children** are receiving educational support via our Street Children Project.

CHILD WELFARE



We delivered outreach sessions, raising awareness of child rights and protection, safety and security, as well as maintaining health and hygiene.
