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WELCOME TO OUR MONTHLY ROUND-UP

During July, we continued to work for every human. We distributed Qurbani as part of our Qurbani distribution programme in Afghanistan, Bangladesh, India, Iraq, Malawi, Nigeria, Pakistan, Kashmir, Palestine, Somalia, Sudan, Syria, Yemen, and the UK, helping families around the world to celebrate Eid al Adha with nutritious protein packed meals.

In Syria, we checked in on children at the psychological clinic we support, distributed bread in the run up to Eid, and visited permanent housing we have already built, whilst continuing to build more. In Palestine, we helped renovate houses, checked the quality of water at the Right to Live Society and helped a little boy who needed eye surgery. In Pakistan, we interviewed a farmer whom we purchase animals for Qurbani from. In Yemen, we helped support the livelihood of a family by providing them a snack cart that will let them build a sustainable income stream. In Lebanon, we learn about little Mohamed Al-Hasan, and celebrate the success of his life saving surgery. After flooding struck Bangladesh, we immediately went into action, providing essential items to those affected by the floods. In Nigeria, we supported the education of orphaned children.

PALESTINE

QURBANI

Over Eid al-Adha, Human Appeal distributed more than **2,021 portions of fresh meat** to families as part of your Qurbani donations.



In the strained conditions of Gaza, Qurbani meat helped people celebrate Eid with full bellies.

WATER

We visited the Right to Live Society, which supports children with autism and Downs Syndrome in Gaza, to check up on the quality of the water after we installed a water desalination plant.



Water is one of the most important needs to meet, especially in water-poor Gaza, where 97% of water is contaminated.



It's important to ensure children have the best shelter possible, and that they feel safe and secure in it.

SHELTER

We helped renovate **80 houses** damaged in the escalation last May, supporting the houses before, during and after the renovations.

HEALTH

Two year old Rayan suffered from visual impairment and a bilateral squint that could eventually have affected his spine and neck. We helped Rayan receive corrective surgery for a bilateral squint, and arranged for him to visit an optician and receive a pair of glasses. Without our support, his condition may have deteriorated further.

PAKISTAN

In Pakistan, Mureed is one of the farmers who we bought animals from this Qurbani One of the most important aspects of our Qurbani project is our commitment to buying animals from farmers in the country and the area we are distributing the meat in, allowing us to provide the beneficiaries of the project with the freshest meat, and supporting the local economy.

"I raise animals for a whole year. Selling them is heartwrenching for me. Indeed, it is hard for me to sell them after a year. After selling, I purchase new animals for next year's sale. I look after the animals with love and care. I make fodder for the animals with my own hands. Even with the rapidly increasing inflation, I purchase the best fodder available in the market. But the buyers do not understand. But, Alhumdulillah, I got a fair price for my animals this year. Before this, selling animals was hard. Even after selling them, I used to get the payment in different instalments. Now with Human Appeal, I have had no worries. I got a fair price for my animals and received the full payment instantly. Human Appeal's initiative is very beneficial for us. Previously, we had to take our animals to the market to sell them. But now we are selling them at our doorstep. I pray they sacrifice more animals so that the farmers adjacent to my village also get an opportunity to sell their animals at their doorstep. Sacrificing more animals will also benefit the poor in my village."

Our Qurbani Programme helps not just those who receive the meat from the sacrifice, but the farmer we buy from and the local community, helping to uplift everyone with dignity and respect.

YEMEN

QURBANI

In Yemen, we sacrificed 1,200 animals, providing 2,400 families with 3.5kg of meat each, helping over 15,000 people to have a joyous Eid meal.



Before our animals are sacrificed for Qurbani, we performed rigorous checks to ensure they were fit and healthy.



Human Appeal considers creating self-sustaining programmes to be one of the cornerstones of sustainable development.

LIVELIHOODS

We provided a snack cart and business training to Mohammad, whose son, Haitham, we had assisted in a battle against cancer. Mohammad sold his house and lost his job in the course of trying to pay for his son's treatment, and this project will help Mohammad support his family again.

SOMALIA

QURBANI

Human Appeal registered **336 families**, newly displaced and living in camps around Mogadishu in the wake of the drought that struck Somalia. Each family received **7kg of meat**, providing **2,016 people** with food for Eid.



In a terrible situation, you have helped provide for Amina and her children.

Amina is freshly displaced from the Lower Shabele region in Somalia, driven from her home village by drought and famine. She travelled to Mogadishu with her four children, leaving her ill husband behind to join them once recovered, hoping for better conditions, as opposed to the terrible famine that has affected much of Somalia.

Caring for four children on your own is a terrible struggle in any situation, let alone in the conditions of Somalia, and on top of that, Amina does laundry to earn some money for her family.

"We don't have proper shelter, latrines, or food. Our situation isn't getting better," Amina told us.

But despite the conditions of the camp, thanks to your help, Amina and her children were able to celebrate Eid with full bellies. As part of our Qurbani programme, she received 7kgs of nutritious meat, which will last both her and her children for up to 30 days.

After a decade of conflict, many children have been seriously affected. It is heart-warming to see that they can still enjoy themselves today.

HEALTH

Our team visited the psychological support clinic in Masshad Rouhin Health Centre, supported by Human Appeal to assist displaced people. They met a number of children who drew images of Dhul Hijjah and Qurbani.

FOOD SECURITY

On the 5th of July, Human Appeal distributed bread in displacement camps in Northwest Syria. In total, we distributed **682 bread bundles** to **522 families**, providing an essential source of sustenance.



Bread is one of the major staple foods. Providing it helps relieve pressure on families who are feeling the strain.





Syrian families, displaced from their homes, are now receiving permanent housing that will keep them safe and comfortable.

SHELTER

A Human Appeal team visited some of the **272 families** living in permanent housing in Al-Sadaqah Camp, as part of the first phase of our housing project, making sure they are settling in well.

SHELTER

We have begun construction on a series of housing units in the Kelly area in the north of Idlib. Intended to provide permanent housing to **1,000** families, each housing unit will have two main rooms, a kitchen with a table, a lavatory, and a foyer.

78 years old, Hadiya Haj Ali has seen much in her life in Syria. But now she faces a challenge of incredible proportion.

Hadiya must care for her grandchildren all on her own, in the difficult conditions of a displacement camp in Ma'Rat Misrin, to the west of Idlib. Both her husband and her son were killed in an explosion near their house, and Hadiya and her grandchildren were subsequently displaced from their home village.

"I suffered a lot after the death of my husband and my son, especially after my son's wife got married and left her children so I became responsible for them under these difficult circumstances. We haven't eaten meat for a long time despite the children's demand for it, but I have no ability to buy it and I am not able to secure many of the requirements of life."

Because of your charity, we were able to visit Hadiya in her tent, and presented her and her grandchildren with a portion of fresh, nutritious meat from Qurbani sacrifices. She was overjoyed to receive it, as it allowed her and her grandchildren to have a fulfilling meal over Eid, and keep portions left over to continue to eat well for a few more days. She thanked all the charitable people who supported her, and who she depends on for the livelihood of herself and her grandchildren.
